LEGACY TOUR 2013—SAN ANTONIO REFLECTIONS

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 25, 11:00AM–5:00PM

The 2013 Emeritus Diplomate Legacy Tour will explore the heritage, culture and cuisine of San Antonio. We will begin with a short walk from the San Antonio Marriott Rivercenter hotel to the Maria Mia Mexican Bistro on the San Antonio River Walk. Here we will enjoy authentic contemporary Tex-Mex cuisine.



After lunch and a short bus ride we will stop at the Buckhorn Museum and the Texas Ranger Museum. The Buckhorn Museum houses a collection featuring hundreds of fish and animals, including many oddities, from all over the world. The adjacent Texas Ranger Museum houses a collection of Texas Ranger artifacts showing the history of this important part of Texas heritage.

Next, we will visit Mission San José. Spanish missions in Texas were not churches, but a center of the community with the church as a focus. Known as the “Queen of the Missions,” this is the largest of the missions and was nearly fully restored to its original design in the 1930’s by the Works Projects Administration (WPA). Mission San José looks much

like it did 250 years ago.

We will then travel a short distance to the Alamo, which is probably the most famous spot in Texas. Here, Davy Crockett, Colonel William Barrett Travis, Jim Bowie, and 186 others died fighting for independence on March 6, 1836. Originally established in 1718 as San Antonio’s first mission, the Alamo is located in the heart of the city, inside beautifully landscaped grounds.

After our trip to the Alamo, we will depart for Market Square in downtown San Antonio. Market Square consists of three markets: Farmers Market, El Mercado, and Produce Row. Shops and stalls sell Mexican fabrics, pottery, leather goods, toys, and jewelry. El Mercado is the largest Mexican market outside of Mexico.
